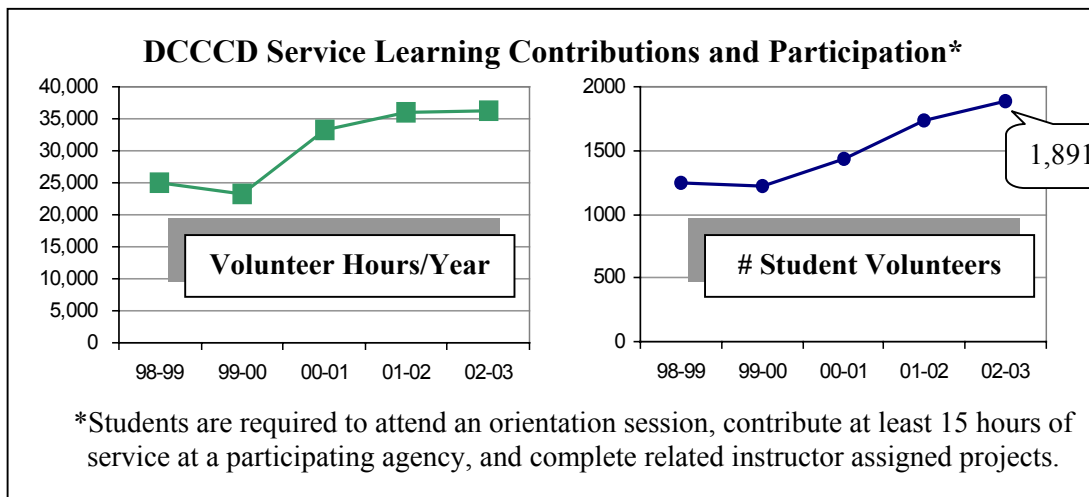

Students complete academic credits and develop civic responsibility while meeting community needs through **Service Learning Programs**. The number of DCCCD students completing all program requirements increased for the third consecutive year. Non-profit agencies received 36,287 hours of volunteer support - the equivalent to \$154,220 at a minimum wage rate.

Students are commended for prior and continued community service through **DCCCD awards** such as the *Max and Rosa Goldblatt Award in Community Service* and the *Marie M. Razkow Service Learning Scholarship*. Applicants are required to meet various eligibility criteria and make a personal commitment of volunteer service in the local community.

Students pursue learning outside of the classroom by participating in college activities. Each college has numerous **clubs and organizations** that address a wide range of student leadership, academic, professional and personal interests. Many such groups also sponsor activities open to the entire student body and members of the local community.
