ACCT 2301 – Principles of Financial Accounting *Must earn a grade of "C" or higher. ACNT 1303 and ACNT 1304 are recommended prior to enrollment in ACCT 2301 for a student with no accounting background.*

ACNT 1311 – Introduction to Computerized Accounting *Must earn a grade of "C" or higher.*

ENGL 1301 – Composition I *This is a (CB 010) Core course. Must earn a grade of "C" or higher.*

Mathematics Core Elective *This is a (CB 020) Core course. Must earn a grade of "C" or higher. There are several options to fulfill this requirement. Contact your academic advisor for a specific list.*

ELECTIVE *Must take any three-hour college-level course to satisfy this elective requirement.*

ACCT 2302 – Principles of Managerial Accounting *Must earn a grade of "C" or higher.*

ACNT 1313 – Computerized Accounting Applications *Must earn a grade of "C" or higher.*

Elective 1 *Note: student needs 2 elective credits. Student may choose to take a 3-credit Ashford course, or transfer in 2 additional credits from a partner institution.*

Please note: course sequence may vary based on course availability and student's individual transfer credit situation. We recommend students work with their Academic Advisor during their second course, to ensure they are not scheduled for any duplicative courses pending their official transfer credit evaluation.
