The AAS degree in Accounting is designed to prepare students for various career opportunities in accounting. Emphasis is placed on accounting procedures and generally accepted accounting principles. This program is intended to provide a foundation on which the graduate can build an accounting career through expanded experiences and/or further education. Courses that complete the Degree (D) and courses that complete the Accounting Assistant (AA1) and Accounting Clerk (AC1) Certificates are noted below.
